# RABBI'S COLUMN

story is told about a rabbi who gave the same sermon every year on the High Holy Days. Now this particular rabbi was especially beloved in his congregation so no one ever questioned him about this. But after several years of hearing the same sermon, the board worked up the courage to approach their dear rabbi and ask him to prepare a new sermon for the Yamim Noraim. So as not to embarrass him they waited until Chanukah to confront the rabbi about his repetitiveness.

Chanukah came and the executive officers paid the rabbi a visit at home. After a pleasant cup of tea, the president said, "Rabbi you know how much we love you. Our only problem is that you've been giving the same sermon on Rosh Hashanah for fifteen years. Don't you think it's time for a new one?"

The rabbi thought for a moment and then said, "Of course, I'd be glad to give a new sermon. By the way, what did I speak about this past year on Rosh Hashanah?" There was a long embarrassed pause. Then the rabbi said, "You seem to have forgotten. I'll tell you what. I'll give the sermon one more time so you'll remember it and then I'll prepare a new one!"

There are really only five sermons that any rabbi has to deliver in his life time. And everything he says is basically a repetition of those same five sermons.

The five sermons are basically the same:

- 1. Be good
- 2. Have faith
- 3. Love one another
- 4. Do Mitzvot
- 5. Learn Torah

The first lesson we all try to teach is "Be good." It's that simple. And we have been teaching it for a very long time. When a gentile came to Hillel and asked the great sage to teach him the whole Torah while standing on one foot, Hillel answered: "What is hateful to you don't do to others." That's a lesson that everyone can understand. Goodness begins by not inflicting pain on others.

That doesn't make us a Tzaddik, a righteous person, but at least it insures that we're not criminals.

The second lesson we try to teach is, "Have faith." For us as Jews this begins with the words of the Sh'ma - "Hear O Israel: Adonai is our God, Adonai is one." But faith is more than just a numerical equation. Faith is a way of seeing the world. To have faith means that you believe that life has some larger meaning and purpose, that your presence in this world is more than just some cosmic accident, and that there is goodness in the universe. It means that you believe that there is a transcendent source of right and wrong – that the Ten Commandments are not opinions. To have faith is also to reject the false idols of this world. If we reject God, chances are we will invent other objects of worship for ourselves.

The third sermon every rabbi must give is, "Love one another." It's not enough just to be good. Judaism expects much more of us. Beyond goodness, there is love. The most important verse in the Torah is "V'ahavta lire'akha kamocha, Love your neighbor as yourself." And as the sages taught us: "Zeh klal gadol ba-torah" – this is the great principle in the Torah.

The fourth sermon that every rabbi gives is, "Do Mitzvot!" Faith and love mean nothing if they are not acted out in our daily lives. The Torah offers us 613 opportunities not only to feel love and express our faith but to do love and live faith through our day to day actions.

And finally, the fifth sermon is "Learn Torah." In Pirke Avot we are taught that an ignorant person cannot be a God fearing person. Faith has no place in an empty mind. Judaism challenges us – the more Torah we learn, the more we are capable of making informed and sensitive decisions in our lives. That is why this holiday is called Rosh Hashanah, literally, "the head" of the year. Why do we begin the year with the head? Because hakol holekh achar ha'rosh, everything follows the head in life. And an empty head will lead to an empty life.

So there you have it. Five sermons. I've now given all my sermons. They are so simple, but the real challenge is that we have to learn



to translate these lessons into life.

The Talmud tells us that Rabbi Akiva was an illiterate shepherd until the age of 40. One day he was sitting by a pond when he noticed that there was a large stone with a hollow indentation in it. He wondered how such a stone could have been worn away. And then he noticed that there was water dripping down on the stone from above and that the water had worn a hole in the stone.

Rabbi Akiva said. If water can wear away the hardest of substances then surely there are words of Torah that can penetrate my mind. I'll go to the Beit Midrash, the house of learning, and begin studying Torah.

I hope that these simple lessons can penetrate our minds and hearts as we begin a new year. Be good. Have faith. Love one another. Do Mitzvot. Learn Torah. There is so much to learn and do in life, but if we can begin with these lessons we will have a truly sweet year.

ne year ago, we were in the midst of an unparalleled financial meltdown. One year later, we have stabilized and see rays of hope that bode well for a recovery.

One year ago, your Board of Governors was preparing for the work ahead. This novice Board was only a few months into its term, full of ideas to help better our Synagogue. Now, one year later, the Board has matured and enters its last term with the knowledge of the many good things they have accomplished and of the many good things they have yet to accomplish.

Let me tell you of some of the many accomplishments of this Board.

Last year, the Adath Israel, along with three other Conservative synagogues, started up a fledgling organization, the Canadian Council of Conservative Synagogues. There were many members who were uneasy and wary of doing this. I can truly say that their concerns have been assuaged, as the CCCS has become a vibrant organization that has accomplished many things. Let us not forget that it is only a vear old and is still feeling growing pains. As a result of these pains, however, the CCCS is now seven synagogues strong with three new synagogues joining rank. There was a very successful and productive convention in Montreal, attended by members, and potential members, of Conservative synagogues from Ontario and Quebec. The convention saw a commitment being made by the CCCS to enhance and involve our youth in programs that will emphasize their Jewish identity and commitment to Yiddishkeit. Another very significant program being championed by the CCCS is its Campus Advocacy program for incoming university students and their parents. The purpose is to empower students with the tools necessary to combat the anti-Semitism and anti-Israel sentiment so prevalent on our university campuses today. A parallel program will be run for parents. For more information on this and other programs, call our office and they will direct you to the appropriate contact. A last word on the CCCS; to our naysayers, please be patient and you will be pleased with the direction we are headed.

Speaking of the direction we are headed, last year we were planning for the retirement of our Cantor Kirshblum. This year, with all the wonderful celebrations now behind us, the Cantor has become our Cantor Emeritus and we wish him much happiness and health in the future. We look forward to many more years of his wisdom and dedication to the shul.

Our new Cantor, Alex Stein, joined the Adath Israel on August 1 and, as the famous line at the end of Casablanca states, "...I think this is the start of a beautiful friendship". On behalf of us all, I want to warmly welcome the Cantor, his wife Shoshonah, and their four children. Please make it a point to introduce yourself over the High Holy Days.

Your Board of Governors also dealt with the issue of attracting new young families as members to the Adath Israel Congregation. We realize that the social landscape is quite different than it was in previous generations. Young families have many financial pressures with which to contend. Joining a synagogue is not high on a modern priority list. After many years, and countless hours spent, I believe that the Membership Committee has come up with a formula that will allow young families to join at a cost that is reconcilable with today's economic realities. This rate is a limited offer and should be taken advantage of as soon as possible. If you are aware of any young families thinking about joining a synagogue, please mention this special offer.

We have many members who need to use handicapped parking. Last year, we dedicated many spaces in our parking lot to accommodate these members. This year is no different. The Security and Decorum Committee has tried its best to make the parking situation palatable. In order to do this mitzvah for our elderly and infirmed members, we ask that you please be understanding. I realize that some of you may have to park far away from the shul or that some of you will be turned back from the parking lot. There simply are not enough spaces for all our members, and the Police and Security force are only doing their jobs. Be courteous, be patient, and let

Adath Israel continually strive to make you feel proud of your Synagogue. We try very hard. Do we always succeed? No we do not. # EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR Adath Israel Champions

any of my editorials have dealt with the role the Adath Israel Congregation can play in helping us lead a fulfilling life and with the sense of community that our membership automatically provides. The direction I want to go forward with is to highlight the richness of our membership by focusing on the contributions that some of our members have made for the betterment of the greater community as well as stories of courage and sacrifice that our members have valiantly displayed.

I am going to refer to these people as champions and the first member that I want to profile is actually an entire family of true champions in the face of adversity. Jonathan and Julie Grossman were married in our shul in 1987, and have been members ever since, making them second generation members. Their family now consists of a daughter Jessica who is 19 and a son Jason who is 17.

They were leading a perfectly normal life as Jonathan worked as an Internet website developer and Julie worked as a Clinical Manager at Baycrest. In early 2009, the dreaded news came that Jonathan, at the youthful age of 46, was diagnosed with a very rare blood disorder that could ultimately result in an incurable form of leukemia unless a bone marrow transplant could be arranged.

Talk about life playing nasty tricks on you. Just when you are in the prime of your life and think you have things under control; you are dealt a blow that shatters your world. Some people may simply fold their cards and drop out of the game, while others rise to the occasion to make the best of a very difficult situation. The Grossmans fit into the latter category.

When the news was finally absorbed, the Grossmans swung into action.

•Julie, Jessica and Jason rallied around Jonathan to form a tight knit family bond as it was only with the full support of his family that Jonathan could manage to cope with his disease at the level he did.

•A match could not be found within Jonathan's immediate family, requiring a much wider search encompassing all the bone marrow donor banks around the world. Jessica and Jason did not waste any time waiting for any possible matches as they started a Facebook group to encourage people to register to become possible bone marrow donors.


•Julie pulled out all the stops and with a team of volunteers, arranged for a community wide bone marrow donor drive to be held at our synagogue. The Grossmans probably set a world record when 1457 people successfully passed the medical screening and had their cheek swabbed in one day at our shul. Since the Canadian Agency responsible for bone marrow matching, OneMatch, wouldn't participate in the Adath Israel drive, the Grossmans retained the services of the Florida-based Gift of Life organization and were forced to fundraise to cover the costs associated with having the swabs processed. Through the generosity of family, friends, community, the shul and even strangers, the Grossman's fundraising efforts were completed just 8 weeks later.

Through it all, the Grossmans have maintained their sense of humour and their dignity and most important – their family spirit and unity. They do not have time to be miserable as they keep pursuing a brighter future. But, there appears to be a bright light at the end of the tunnel as Jonathan was scheduled for a bone marrow transplant at the end of July; after this editorial had already gone to press.

Also, not to be forgotten is the possibility that some of the people

tested at our clinic will be a match for other families in need. This was made possible through the Grossman's



I have already been informed that some attendees at our clinic have been contacted by the Gift of Life organization as a result of the cheek swab given at the Adath Israel and advised that they may be a possible match to help save other lives.

In the Ethics of our Fathers (Pirkei Avos), Rabbi Shimon said there are three crowns – the crown of torah, the crown of priesthood, and the crown of kingship; but the crown of a good name surpasses them all. The Good name of the Jonathan Grossman family is a perfect representation of Rabbi Shimon's wise words and our congregational community is all the richer for their being part of our chevra.

At this time, my daughter Laura and I want to wish you and your family a healthy, happy and a sweet New Year.

# Days of Awe

This period is devoted to a careful examination of who we are in an attempt to become cognizant of the ways we have failed - failed others, failed our own selves, and failed God. This introspection is meant to lead to regret and remorse for the harm we have done, to attempts at restitution when possible and to turning away from our past selves to our better selves who will act differently in the coming new year.

# Rosh Hashanah

this process of inner change is a difficult one, hence the rabbis began it well in advance of Yom Kippur so as to leave plenty of time to accomplish it. During the month of Elul, we begin to examine our lives and our relationships. Then comes Rosh Hashanah which is referred to in the Torah as Yom Teruah - the Day of Sounding the Shofar - or Yom HaZikaron - the Day of Remembering. It was not called Rosh Hashanah - the New Year - until Talmudic times. The focal place for our observance of Rosh Hashanah is the synagogue. The liturgy's main theme is that of God as King - Melekh, the One who created the world and continues to renew His creation. The themes of God as King and Rosh Hashanah as the birthday of the world are intertwined with those stating that this is a period of repentance, that God is in the process of judging all living things.

The ten day period of repentance, beginning with *Rosh Hashanah*, adds to the thought of memory the idea of judgment. Individuals must judge their own actions and take steps to eradicate personal sins and errors as well as injuries done to others. God will forgive or punish transgressions against Him as He sees fit; our primary concern is to conduct ourselves in a Godly manner toward humanity and all creatures on earth, who are all creations of God.

The outstanding and best remembered custom of *Rosh Hashanah* is the blast of the shofar. The sounds of the ram's horn, the oldest of wind instruments, are meant to awaken our slumbering souls to time's passage, to what we have done and, more importantly, to what we could do with our lives. The ram's horn is used because, when Abraham was about to express his supreme faith by offering up his son Isaac, it was a ram caught in the bushes which became the substitute sacrifice.

The new year gives us a chance to reshape our lives in our better image by reminding us of our humanity and our relationship to the Divine. All this preparation is training in order to be ready for the spiritual marathon of *Yom Kippur* - the day on which we almost ceaselessly pray for forgiveness and renewal. The tradition uses the image of a life-and-death contest for the imagery of the *Yom Kippur* liturgy in that each of us is judged as to "who shall live and who shall die" in the coming year.



Tashlich

n the first day of *Rosh Hashanah* in the afternoon, it is customary to gather at a body of water for a ritual which demonstrates that sin can be separated from our lives into the water. We symbolically cast away our sins of the year gone by and we reaffirm our intention that life, in the new year, will be inspired by a new heart and a new spirit.

Who is a God like You, forgiving iniquityandremittingtransgressions; Who has not maintained His wrath forever against the remnant of His own people, because He loves graciousness! He will take us back in love; He will cover up our iniquities. You will hurl all our sins into the depths of the sea. You will keep faith with Jacob, loyalty to Abraham, as You promised an oath to our fathers in days gone by.

Micha 7:18-20

In all of 'My sacred mount' nothing evil or vile shall be done; For the land shall be filled with devotion to the Lord as waters cover the sea. Isaiah 11:9 Everyone is invited to meet at **Bathurst** and **Timberlane at 5:45 p.m. on Sunday**, **September 20th**. The ceremony will take us to the Don River to say the prayers and throw our sins away, hopefully for good. All ages are invited to join us.

# Yom Kippur

Whether we believe literally in the imagery of *Yom Kippur* as the Day of Judgment or see it as only symbolic, those images confront us with our mortality and warn us that the time for *teshuvah* is now. This process of *teshuvah* - repentance - will hopefully culminate in forgiveness - our forgiving those who hurt us; others forgiving us; and finally God forgiving us. It is literally a process of atonement that allows us to become at one with God and with the rest of humanity.

The setting of *Yom Kippur* has shifted from the temple, in biblical times, to the synagogue, where we spend almost the whole day in prayer. The day is structured around its five services - one more than is usual for a Shabbat or festival. They are:

*Kol Nidre:* the evening service named after its opening prayer

*Shacharit:* the morning service *Musaf:* the additional service, which includes the martyrology and the *avodah* - a

description of the temple service *Minchah:* afternoon service

*Ne'ilah:* the service that is unique in the liturgical calendar and concludes *Yom Kippur*.

*Yom Kippur* is also marked by a series of five restrictions, regarded by the rabbis as commanded by the Torah: (1) no eating or drinking; (2) no bathing; (3) no anointing of the body with oil; (4) no wearing of leather shoes; (5) no sexual relations. All of these activities were considered physically pleasurable.

As the most solemn day of the year, *Yom Kippur* is treated more like Shabbat than like a festival with respect to the laws prohibiting work, for the day is called *Shabbat Shabbaton* – a Sabbath of complete rest.

Thus, on *Yom Kippur* we are meant to feel that the natural course of our existence is suspended on this day while our lives, or at least the quality of our lives, hang in the balance. We are to face what a permanent suspension of existence – death – would be like, and thus learn how to better embrace life.

# SHUL NEWS

## **Update: Canadian Council of Conservative Synagogues**

There have been many new developments and initiatives since the last update on CCCS. There are now two congregations in Montreal who have joined (Shaare Zedek and Shaar Shalom), and one congregation in Oakville (B'nai Shalom of Halton Peel), in addition to the four founding members in Toronto, Beth Emeth Bais Yehuda, Adath Israel, Beth Tzedec, and Beth Sholom.

The principle of **community building** undergirds much of what CCCS undertakes, especially in the area of education. This is reflected in the decision to support the offering of Hebrew as a credit course for teens across the GTA (through Halton Hills Learning Centre), slated to begin after Labour Day. It was also reflected in its decision to support the Melton Adult Mini School, a well respected ongoing series of classes which has been in Toronto for 8 years. Both of these educational programs are across the board, open to all in the community, and not just the Conservative community.

Another crucial need was recognized with regard to our University students and the anti-Israelism and anti-Semitism that they face on our campuses. A program is in the works that will be directed to the incoming University students and their parents: it will be strengthening of Jewish identity, ways to advocate for Israel and how to respond, as well as ways to take advantage of Jewish life on campus. There will be more details shortly.

In June of 2010, the world will see the G8 conference in Canada.

Religious Leaders have been gathering to help plan the parallel Religious Leaders Summit, which will be held just a few days prior to the G8, and whose mission it is to keep the political leaders on track with regard to humanitarian issues. CCCS has been present at the planning meetings for this summit since January.




